CALL TO ORDER

Pursuant to public notice, the meeting commenced at 11:00 a.m. with a Call to Order by Board Chair, Danny Dukes. Roll call was taken and quorum established.

I. ADMINISTRATIVE

MOTION: Motion was made by Nate Cochran, Director and seconded by Mary Jo Dukes, Director, to approve the minutes of the July 9, 2018 Cherokee Charter Academy Inc. meeting. Motion was approved unanimously (5-0).

II. CSUSA REPRTS

PRINCIPAL REPORT

Principal, April Wallis, discussed Cherokee Charter Academy's dedication of our STEM
Lab in memory of parent, Karen Collins. Board chair, Danny Dukes, requested Cherokee
Charter Academy Inc. to honor the memory of parent Karen Collins with the Karen
Collins STEM Lab.

MOTION: Motion was made by Nate Cochran, Director and seconded by Susan Imrie, Director, to adopt said resolution for honoring Karen Collins. Motion was approved unanimously (5-0).

- Principal, April Wallis, discussed Milestones results for FY18. Cherokee Charter
 Academy did grown on all levels. We did not show growth in 8th grade EOG for math or
 ELA due to the fact that Cherokee Charter Academy advanced/accelerated students
 took 9th grade literature and Algebra 1 and therefore took the EOC not EOG for those
 subjects.
- Principal, April Wallis, discussed enrollment for FY19. Cherokee Charter Academy will be hosting their second informational session August 28, 2018. Expected higher numbers in September.
- April Wallis, Principal, discussed Cherokee Charter Academy personnel roster. Two
 teachers have left; Daphne Mullen and Amanda Shelley. Cherokee Charter Academy has
 since hired four new staff members; Kara Mathis (SPED), Kari Masters (3rd grade), Hayley
 Erck (SPED), and Chelsea Noble (clinic aide).

III. FINANCIALS

- Lisanne Morton, Finance, CSUSA, discussed Cherokee Charter Academy's finances.
 Board Chair, Danny Dukes, questioned the issue that CSUSA had with Cherokee Charter
 Academy pension. Rita Weaver, Board Governance Manager, CSUSA, explained how
 there was a breakdown in payroll and the HRS team. This breakdown has been
 resolved. Board Chair, Danny Dukes, inquired if this error would affect FY 19 budget.
 Hillary Daigle, Finance, CSUSA, acknowledged that FY19 budget would be affected and
 took full responsibility as the overseer of CSUSA accounting department.
- Board Director, Susan Imrie, inquired as to if the teachers were adversely affected by this error. Rita Weaver, Board Governance Manager, CSUSA, shared that teachers were not affected in an adverse way.
- Lisanne Morton, Finance, CSUSA, discussed Cherokee Charter Academy Framework proforma analysis coming in at 80 points. A robust discussion ensued.
